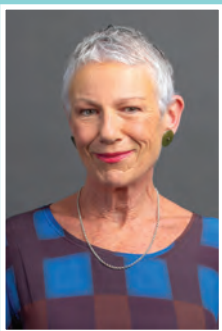


IS SCIENCE MAKING OUR FOOD SAFER?
