Speaker Biographies



Hon. Tim Groser

International trade expert; former NZ chief agriculture negotiator and Trade Minister

After joining the NZ Treasury as a junior economist in 1973, Tim became deeply involved in Australia/NZ economic relationships which then evolved into the CER Agreement. In the early 1980s, Tim served as the Foreign Affairs adviser to both Prime Minister Muldoon and Prime Minister David Lange in the Prime Minister's Department. In 1986, Tim was then appointed NZ Chief Trade Negotiator with responsibility for the last successful multilateral Trade Negotiating Round, the Uruguay Round. He served as Ambassador to Indonesia 1994-97 (Tim's first involvement with the Geothermal Industry (the Wayang Windu 600 MW plant built by NZ). In 2002 Tim was appointed Ambassador to the WTO and chaired the Agriculture Negotiating Group – the first New Zealander to do so. He served as NZ Trade Minister, NZ Climate Change Minister (International) and Associate Minister of Foreign Affairs 2008-15. From 2016-19 Tim was Ambassador to the United States. Tim was recently appointed Chair of the Advisory Group on Supercritical Geothermal Energy.



Lain Jager

Director Zespri and a2 Milk

Lain is best known for being CEO of ZESPRI from 2008 to 2017. This was a challenging period for ZESPRI including Importer issues in China and Taiwan, the deregulation campaign run by Turners and Growers, and most severely the bacterial disease Psa. Despite these challenges Zespri grew strongly, grower returns doubled, and the share price grew from \$1.00 to \$8.00. Perhaps most importantly, under Lain's tenure the culture of the company matured, enabling the development of the genuinely global approach to sales and marketing that exists today. Today, Lain invests across a range of businesses in Tourism, Technology, Food, and Agribusiness. Lain was the Chairman of the Primary Sector Council which produced the Fit for a Better World Report focused on the New Zealand Food and Fibre Sector and was Co-Chair of Te Puna Whakaaronui – a Food and Fibre think tank. Current Directorships include: The a2 Milk Company, Arepa, Nibblish, New Zealand Avocado Oil, Origin Capital Management, Redwoods Treewalk, Rubisco and Zespri. In addition to this Lain sits on the advisory Board of the Sustainable Nutrition Initiative. Lain and his wife Debra live on a lifestyle block in Tauranga, New Zealand.

Jo Hendy is Chief Executive of New Zealand's Climate Change Commission, where she leads independent advice to help the country move toward a low-emissions, climate-resilient future that works for everyone. Jenny Bishop

Director, Food Risk Management, New Zealand Food Safety

Jenny is the Director Food Risk Management. She leads a Directorate in New Zealand Food Safety which protects public health, maintains confidence in the safety and suitability of food through identification, assessment and management of potential food safety risks. She works closely with industry stakeholders and international partners to uphold New Zealand's high standards of food safety, ensuring compliance with global market requirements. The Directorate includes Emerging Risk, Food Compliance Services, Regulatory Standard setting and Readiness and Response functions. Jenny has worked in various parts of the food safety system for 25 years, including health protection, compliance, enforcement, standard development and food safety response management with positions held at international, national, regional and local levels. Prior to joining MPI, Jenny worked for the World Health Organization, being posted in Suva, Manila and Geneva assisting countries in the development of national food control system and coordinating the management of international food safety concerns. She was also part of the New Zealand Food Safety Authority and the Ministry of Health when it held the food safety mandate.

Nicola is a seasoned executive in New Zealand's food and beverage sector, with over 20 years of experience spanning innovation, marketing, sales, and general management roles. She has held leadership positions at companies such as Comvita (as Chief Digital Officer) and Lewis Road Creamery (as General Manager), where she was instrumental in launching innovation into global markets across Australasia, the USA, and China. Professor Black's research interests are in ecosystem resilience and how we can ensure that our lands are protected and supported to be healthy.

He was elected as Fellow of the Royal Society of New Zealand in 2014 and made Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit in 2023 for services to epidemiology.

Alexander Richter is a Professor of Human-Centric AI and the inaugural Director of the AI Initiative at the University of Auckland. He studies how people and AI can work together in ways that improve performance, preserve human values and build institutional capability. Across these areas, he develops frameworks that help organisations decide what AI can do and, more importantly, what it should do. Alex believes in engaged scholarships and has advised governments and organisations across three continents. He is also a passionate teacher and received the 2024 Association for Information Systems Innovation in Teaching Award for his teaching approach, "Learning Out Loud".
